


Getting started with Hypothesis at UCLA

Hypothesis is an easy-to-use pedagogical tool that enables students and teachers to have conversations in the margins of digital texts. At UCLA, you can use Hypothesis annotation on course readings that are stored in your Bruin Learn site, or with VitalSource etexts through Inclusive Access or Bruin One Access.



This **social annotation tool** is installed directly in Bruin Learn and is available to you now. Adding Hypothesis to readings supports student success by placing active discussion right on top of course readings.

Teaching with Hypothesis

Why use Hypothesis social annotation in your courses?

Asking your students to annotate course readings before class:

- ✓ Holds students accountable for completing the reading
- ✓ Provides you with information about student questions and confusions to address in class

Sample annotation assignments

- Create more active discussion in flipped/hybrid classrooms
- ✓ Replace discussion boards with authentic conversations within annotations
- ✓ Annotate academic articles to model reading published research
